A huge well done to all of our Year 6 and Year 2 pupils who completed their SATs examinations this half term. We are so proud of them and we tell them every day that a test does not measure who they are. We look ahead to a fantastic final half term filled with lots of events and learning!

As is usual at this time of year, there are always updates to the staffing profile in readiness for the new academic year. Following the 31st May, schools are in a position to share with families the new staffing schedule for the next year and we intend to share this after the half term break.

Miss Bergman, the new Executive Headteacher, will be working at Woodslee from 19th June 2023. She will be working alongside myself and is eager to meet you and our children. Please do say hello and introduce yourself when you see her, she is excited to really understand the Woodslee community. I will continue to serve Woodslee until I start my new position as Headteacher at Stanton Road Primary School. Miss Bergman and I will continue to work and support each other as Stanton Road Primary where I am moving to is within the same Bromborough and Bebington cluster group in Wirral.

We congratulate Mrs Haggett who has been appointed as the Deputy Head of Co-op Academy Woodslee. Mrs Haggett has been the Assistant Headteacher at Woodslee for over six years. She will have less time as a class teacher in her new role from September but will strengthen the leadership of the school as she has knowledge of our families, curriculum and our community- she will be a great support to Miss Bergman.

Mrs Wolstenholme has a lot of experience and has served the community of Woodslee as a Governor since Woodslee joined the Co-op Academies Trust in 2018.

A very warm welcome to the children and families and Co-op Academy Hillside who have recently joined the Trust. This is now the fourth school in Wirral who are part of the Co-op MAT.

Thank you parents and carers for your attendance to our key events during this very busy half term. We really appreciate it as you're balancing work life and family life- it is a hard balance to strike. Our Love Learning Event, class assemblies, educational visits and sports days have been really well attended! We are so blessed to have such a supportive community.

Buttercup Class

This half term Buttercup class has really enjoyed getting to know each other and settling into our new classroom. We have loved exploring all of the new resources and sharing them with our new friends. Together we have learnt about our classroom routines and our expectations.

This half term Buttercup class has been learning about 'My Garden'. We have been focusing on the story 'The Hungry Caterpillar' by Eric Carle. We really enjoyed making a giant caterpillar using all of our handprints for the caterpillar's body and decorating butterflies using different materials. The children have learnt some of the vocabulary from the story and were able to use their fine motor skills to separate the egg, caterpillars, butterflies and cocoons and name each one. We have also been learning to draw simple shapes, we had lots of fun using the lightbox to make our marks.



We talked about our favourite fruit and had a tasting session, where we even had a go at cutting the fruit ourselves. We blended all our favourite fruits together and made a Buttercup Class smoothie, it was yummy!



To celebrate the King's Coronation we learnt all about King Charles. We decorated crowns, splatter painted the King's silhouette, built castles and read stories about the King's underpants!

Apple Class

This half term Apple class has been learning about growing. We have been focusing on two stories, 'Jaspers Beanstalk' by Nick Butterworth and 'It starts with a seed' by Laura Knowles. All of the children have planted their own seeds and watched them grow like Jasper. In maths we have been counting the correct number of flowers into the pots, subitising to match the dominoes, creating repeating patterns and finding out how much a ladybird weighs!









We have been investigating printing, using the heads of flowers and different items around the classroom, such as lego, to print on our flower template. Some of us even used our maths learning to create repeating patterns on our flowers.



We have been working extremely hard at writing out names correctly and to write some of the sounds that we have been learning correctly also. The adults in EYFS have been so amazed by all of our writing. We have all started to write more independently in the continuous provision this half term.

Blossom Class

Blossom class have loved our topic on growing. We have grown cress from seeds and we



have learnt that plants need water, food (soil), sunlight and space to grow.

We have even been looking after a Venus Fly Trap plant, we know the bright colours and the scent attract insects and then the leaves close and the plant actually eats the insect!

We visited Brotherton Park to look at the different plants and leaves and we loved playing a 'Hug the Tree' game.



We have learnt about the primary colours - red, yellow and blue. We practised mixing colours to make green and brown to add to our paintings of plants and then we labelled the roots, stem, leaves and petals.

In the construction area, we have been focusing on drawing plans of what we are going to

make which has really helped us to explain our ideas. Jack and The Beanstalk has been our focus book in English lessons. We have done really well with learning how to sound out words to improve our writing and we have increased our vocabulary through using words such as scrambled and furious.

We have learnt how to double and halve in maths. Ask us to double any number between 1 and 5 and we can use our fingers to help.

In Year 1 this term we have been reading the fabulous book 'Toys in Space' by Mini Grey.


We have all really enjoyed this story, especially when we got to plan a party for Hoctopize so that we can share our wonderful work with our friends in Year 2.

What a fun and exciting term we have had. We are looking forward to our final term as Year 1s!

Cherry Class

It has been another wonderful half-term in Year 2, full of learning and fun (and a few SATs papers!) Children have truly worked so hard over the past few weeks and I am immensely proud of their attitude towards their learning.



In English we have been reading 'The Last

Wolf by Mini Grey. Children engaged in debates about the heroes and villains of this story, considered the effect of deforestation on animals and even went on a litter pick to help save



our environment. We ended the unit by writing a letter to Rishi Sunak, the Prime Minister, to encourage citizens of the UK to plant more trees!

In our reading lessons, we have been developing our confidence in reading aloud and using appropriate 'voice choices'. Some children were brave enough to be the teacher and read the story at the end of the day! We have also taken advantage of the sunny weather and enjoyed story time outside.

During our Maths lessons we have been focusing on fractions and time. Year 2 have worked to find halves, quarters and thirds of a number or shape and have applied this to two-step problems. Children have also learnt to tell the time to the nearest 5 minutes and have been very keen to spot when the clock strikes 10:45 and it is break time!

Our Science lessons this half-term have centred on how we can change the shape of materials and how this affects their uses. We loved using play-dough to twist, stretch, bend and squish. Children also particularly enjoyed learning about John McAdam and the invention of modern-day roads. They were shocked to find out that before him, roads were made of chalk!





In Music we have been learning all about 'Peter and the Wolf' by Sergei Prokofiev. We've considered the timbre of different instruments, learnt what a conductor does and performed a musical walk through a forest! We are really looking forward to our trip to the Liverpool Philharmonic in June.

Rowan Class

It's been another half term of incredible learning and fun in Year Three! We invited Bruno, the therapy dog, into the classroom so children could learn how to care for other living creatures. I'm not sure who enjoyed the grooming the most- Bruno or the children! A highlight of the half term was the swimming lessons that every Year 3 child participated in. The children couldn't believe their eyes when they saw their very own pool on the playground and their enthusiasm and tenacity for learning to swim was extremely impressive.





Our history topic this half term has been 'The Romans'. Children have learned a lot about how the Romans have influenced life in Britain today and they were all big fans of Boudicca- our very own female role model of strength and bravery against adversity. We linked this series of learning with art and children created some lovely mosaics, drawings of centurions and sketches of Roman emperors.

In music, we have been learning how to read music and play tuned percussion instruments. The children are doing such a good job of keeping the beat and hitting (mostly!) the right notes!



Science has been all about plants! Children have been investigating the ideal conditions for a plant to grow.

To learn about the way that water is transported around the plant, they introduced dye into a white flower's water and followed it as it was absorbed into the leaves and petals. They wondered what would happen in extra cold and extra warm conditions, so they left one flower by

the oven in the kitchen (thanks for your help Tonia!) and put ice cubes in the water of another. Have a chat with your child to find

out what happened. We were all quite surprised by the results.

Coronation and Eurovision fever gripped us this half term. Children learned about the history of the monarchy and the crowning of King Charles III and made flags and collages to celebrate. Hopefully you will have all seen our fantastic TikTok video that we created for Eurovision. It's on our social media pages so do have a look if you haven't seen it yet. The video of our 'Woodslee Does Eurovision' will be released shortly-

please vote for Rowan Class! We represented Ireland and the children treated the whole school to a rousing performance of the Irish traditional song 'Tell Me Ma.' They are such a musical bunch. Well done, Rowan class!

The year is absolutely flying by and I can not believe that we are just about to enter our final term of Year Three. Let's make it the best one yet! Have a wonderful half term break and I can't wait to see you when you get back.

kind, loving and interested in how to look after them!






